MR. PINNOCK: It is the 10th of July 2018. It's Fred Pinnock calling Kash Heed at [REDACTED], and I'm calling now.

MR. HEED: Hello there, Mr. Pinnock.

MR. PINNOCK: Kash, it's been about eight years too late for me to call you to say hi. How are you, brother?

MR. HEED: Oh, no, don't worry about that. Once a friend, always a friend. It doesn't matter how many years go by.

MR. PINNOCK: Good for you. I feel the same. So how's life with you? Are you still teaching?

MR. HEED: Life is always interesting. Life goes on. Believe it or not, I just got back from 90 days in India for work.

MR. PINNOCK: Wow.

MR. HEED: Yeah.

7 MR. HEED: Well, yeah, that's what I'm calling, but

9 MR. PINNOCK: Sure. I'm a lumpy old guy with a limp
10 but still giving her. I'm still in the gym
11 about five days a week, and --

12 MR. HEED: Yeah.

13 MR. PINNOCK: -- life is good, Kash. Now, I mean, I
14 go back and forth between [REDACTED]
15 at least on a weekly basis. We have a place up
16 in [REDACTED] the lake. It's just
17 sensational. And ...

18 MR. HEED: Fantastic.

19 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah. I've got to send you a photo
20 of -- from our deck. It's just so
21 life-extending and peaceful.

22 MR. HEED: And what is Naomi doing now?

23 MR. PINNOCK: Well, she, as you know, took advantage
24 of the bridge income thing --

25 MR. HEED: Yeah.

1 MR. PINNOCK: -- after the electoral outcome of
2 15 months ago.

3 MR. HEED: Yeah.

4 MR. PINNOCK: And she is -- she has completely
5 invested herself. Because you know she's a
6 worker.

7 MR. HEED: Yeah.

8 MR. PINNOCK: She has this place operating like a top
9 with more garden plots than I can count. She's
10 growing tomatoes and about 18 different other
11 vegetables, riding her bike and looking good.

12 MR. HEED: Yeah.

13 MR. PINNOCK: And she's rested and -- you know, until
14 the last couple of days, a stress-free life.

15 MR. HEED: So she's not going to get back into the
16 political world, is she?

17 MR. PINNOCK: By no means, no.

18 MR. HEED: Yeah.

19 MR. PINNOCK: She did her thing.

20 MR. HEED: Yeah.

21 MR. PINNOCK: She did her thing, and I'm, frankly,
22 very happy that she's not looking at that.

23 MR. HEED: Yeah, yeah. Well, that is -- that's very
24 good. Well, say hello to her to me [sic].

25 But more importantly -- so I've been kind of

1 who I [indiscernible] ██████ for him all of a
2 sudden to take advantage of this like he's the
3 god's savior here, I said -- fuck's sakes. Part
4 of the problem is the minute you pulled IIGET,
5 the minute, I said, ██████ started to raise some
6 concerns about of what is going on and telling
7 what is going on in the casino, in wanting the
8 positions filled --

9 MR. PINNOCK: M'mm-hmm.

10 MR. HEED: -- to their capacity, all of a sudden the
11 unit's pulled.

12 MR. PINNOCK: M'mm-hmm.

13 MR. HEED: Now, you're bringing one of the decision
14 makers back to review it. I said, how
15 hypocritical is that, David?

16 MR. PINNOCK: M'mm-hmm. M'mm-hmm.

17 MR. HEED: He was just quiet on the phone. He was
18 very quiet on the phone.

19 MR. PINNOCK: He didn't know the backstory, I guess.

20 MR. HEED: Well, no, I don't think he did. And
21 there's a lot of people that have come to me
22 since that. What the fuck is ██████
23 doing? Because he's got three other contracts
24 with him now.

25 MR. PINNOCK: It's funny, old Mounties and government

1 contracts.

2 MR. HEED: Yes, well, you've got all of them over
3 there in police services. [REDACTED]

8 guys here. It's just -- they're the most

12 place in the casinos. Well -- and I pointed
13 out -- now, who did I point it out to just a
14 little while ago? Was it Mike Smith [phonetic]
15 on NW? And I pointed out the fact that the
16 casinos are just the -- you know, one piece of
17 the puzzle.

18 I said, there's so much going on that
19 government's been made aware of, and nobody
20 takes any action on it. I said, the casinos
21 are -- they're basically easy. It should have
22 never got to that point, but it's because of
23 decisions they made that it got to that point.
24 But that's easy to fix, and whether there's a
25 will to fix it or not.

1 Because, I tell you, Bob Stewart, who's --
2 you know Bob?

3 MR. PINNOCK: I love Bob. Straight shooter.

4 MR. HEED: So he's back there. He's back doing
5 something on the casino part of things.

6 MR. PINNOCK: Oh, good, good.

7 MR. HEED: And you know those 15 positions that are
8 supposed to monitor the casinos?

9 MR. PINNOCK: M'mm-hmm.

10 MR. HEED: You know how many they've filled?

11 MR. PINNOCK: No.

12 MR. HEED: Three.

13 MR. PINNOCK: Wow.

14 MR. HEED: He says he's -- they're not -- they're
15 just not filling them. They're not going to
16 fill those positions. It's all smoke and
17 mirrors. This whole report is just smoke and
18 mirrors. You've got to consider the author of
19 the report.

20 MR. PINNOCK: M'mm-hmm.

21 MR. HEED: ████████ he's been smoke and mirrors his
22 entire career, and it continues on with just
23 smoke and mirrors.

24 So when I was just watching your stuff and
25 reading the comments about Coleman saying oh,

1 this is slanderous. Oh, I tell you, I'll back
2 you up 100 percent, Freddie [phonetic], on any
3 of that bullshit --

4 MR. PINNOCK: Kash, thanks, man.

5 MR. HEED: -- going on there.

6 MR. PINNOCK: It has been -- you know, it's been
7 somewhat cathartic, Kash, to finally come out
8 and say what happened, but it's also dredged up
9 some very painful episodes in my -- at the end
10 of my service where, you know, I felt chest
11 pains coming back and all that sort of thing --

12 MR. HEED: Yeah.

13 MR. PINNOCK: -- that I haven't felt in nine years.
14 But it's worth it, and it's absolutely -- the
15 public has a right to know this.

16 MR. HEED: Well, they certainly do. And Holland -- I
17 can't get Holland to come [indiscernible].

18 MR. PINNOCK: M'mm-hmm.

19 MR. HEED: He won't. He's as stern as can be. I
20 don't know what he's scared of. He's not doing
21 anything, not looking to do anything with
22 government, but he just won't come out and talk
23 about it.

24 MR. PINNOCK: It's because Wayne's a really
25 principled dude.

1 MR. HEED: He is. He is. You know, I was helping
2 him out when he went after Jamie Graham there
3 when Jamie tried to come after him, and fuck,
4 I -- the stuff I helped him out with. And I was
5 thinking well, you know, when this all started
6 to break, that he would come out and start to
7 talk a little bit about it.

8 MR. PINNOCK: M'mm-hmm.

9 MR. HEED: You know?

10 MR. PINNOCK: Because he shared our view about --

11 MR. HEED: Yeah.

12 MR. PINNOCK: -- the manipulation and interference
13 back in the day; right?

14 MR. HEED: He knew all about it.

15 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah.

16 MR. HEED: He knew all about it.

17 MR. PINNOCK: Well, maybe one day the time will be
18 right for him.

19 MR. HEED: Well, I hope so. But it was -- yeah, I
20 just wanted to -- you know, you thank god the
21 number was still the same and said, good for
22 you, Fred. Good for you.

23 MR. PINNOCK: Thank you, Kash, very much. It means a
24 lot coming from you. I've always had respect.

25 MR. HEED: You know --

1 MR. PINNOCK: Now, let me --

2 MR. HEED: Because the whistle -- you know the

3 original -- the whistle-blower --

4 MR. PINNOCK: M'mm-hmm.

5 MR. HEED: -- Ross what's his name, he came to me.

6 MR. PINNOCK: Now, which Ross was that, sorry?

7 MR. HEED: Ross -- hang on a second.

8 MR. PINNOCK: [Indiscernible]?

9 MR. HEED: I know his last name. No, no. Hang on.

10 He came to me because I know his father-in-law.

11 Let me just pull this up here. Ross Alderson.

12 MR. PINNOCK: I don't think I know him.

13 MR. HEED: Okay. So Ross was the guy that worked for

14 the investigation branch that went to Sam Cooper

15 and gave Sam what was going on.

16 MR. PINNOCK: Oh, is that right? Okay. Good for

17 him.

18 MR. HEED: Yeah, he's the whistle-blower.

19 MR. PINNOCK: Okay.

20 MR. HEED: And he told me the whole story.

21 MR. PINNOCK: M'mm-hmm.

22 MR. HEED: And yeah, it's unbelievable. He used to

23 be a cop in Australia.

24 MR. PINNOCK: Okay.

1 And he's the one that had the Paul Jin case and
2 started to break things wide open and then saw
3 that nobody inside the investigation -- there
4 was a Mountie that he reported to -- wouldn't do
5 anything about it. Wouldn't do a single thing.

6 MR. PINNOCK: M'mm-hmm.

7 MR. HEED: So he -- you know, he took it to Sam
8 Cooper at the media. He met Sam and told him
9 the entire story.

13 quit, and they just gave him three months. I
14 said, there's no way you should quit, you know.

17 He said yeah, we'll protect the whistle-blower.
18 But you know, his -- the Mountie guy, his
19 superior, just talked him into quitting, taking
20 three months.

21 MR. PINNOCK: Probably making his life miserable, I
22 would guess, and he was probably --

23 MR. HEED: Yeah, they did that. They did that to me,
24 and I told them to go fuck themselves.

25 MR. PINNOCK: M'mm-hmm.

1 MR. HEED: So I --

2 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah.

3 MR. HEED: They tried that with me when I was in
4 government. I stood my ground and said screw
5 you.

6 MR. PINNOCK: M'mm-hmm.

7 MR. HEED: You know, we know what this is all about.

8 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah.

9 MR. HEED: So ...

10 MR. PINNOCK: Well, listen, let me ask you, how is
11 your daughter?
