UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Hi. How are [indiscernible]?

MR. PINNOCK: Very well. How are you?

UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Good.

MR. PINNOCK: Good. I did not reserve or anything. It's just for two, and I'm the first.

UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Okay. And your name is ...

MR. PINNOCK: Fred.

UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Fred. Can you [indiscernible] for two.

MR. PINNOCK: Table 14 is it?

UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: I'm going to take you. It's right this way, right here.

MR. PINNOCK: Thanks. Thank you.

UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: You're welcome. How is

1 your morning so far?

2 MR. PINNOCK: Really good. Thank you for asking.

3 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Good to hear that.

4 MR. PINNOCK: That will work out fine.

5 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: [Indiscernible.]

6 MR. PINNOCK: Thanks.

7 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: You're welcome. Your

8 server will be with you in just a bit.

9 MR. PINNOCK: Thanks.

10 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: [Indiscernible.]

11 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: How are you doing there?

12 MR. PINNOCK: I'm well. How are you?

13 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Good. Thanks.

7 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Yes, sir. No worries.

8 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: How are you doing over

9 here?

10 MR. PINNOCK: Really well. How are you?

11 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: [Indiscernible.]

12 MR. PINNOCK: You're kind to ask. I'm fine.

13 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: You're okay?

14 MR. PINNOCK: Thanks. Yeah.

15 You're a sight for sore eyes.

16 MR. HEED: Look at you, mister.

17 MR. PINNOCK: Good to see you.

18 MR. HEED: How are you doing? Good to see you.

19 MR. PINNOCK: You look lean and fit, man.

3 MR. HEED: Yes.
4 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: You betcha.
5 MR. PINNOCK: You rascal. You've already got your
6 [indiscernible] in, haven't you?
7 MR. HEED: Yeah.
8 MR. PINNOCK: Good for you.
9 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: For yourself?
10 MR. PINNOCK: I'll just stick with water, please.
11 I'm going to train later.
12 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Stick with water.
13 Longboard Lager's on the way, and I'll be back.
14 MR. PINNOCK: Do you remember the old Gold's Gym by
15 Cap Mall?
16 MR. HEED: Yeah, yeah.
17 MR. PINNOCK: They fulfilled their 20-year commitment
18 to Gold's as a franchisee, and they rebranded as
19 Genesis.
20 MR. HEED: Oh, okay. So [indiscernible] Genesis.
21 MR. PINNOCK: It is.
22 MR. HEED: It's still there?
23 MR. PINNOCK: It is. And Roy and Wade, the two
24 brothers, just sold about a year ago to a young
25 couple --

1 MR. HEED: Yeah.

2 MR. PINNOCK: -- sponsored by dad, who is, I think,
3 one of the principals of Bed Bath & Beyond. So
4 they spared no expense. The equipment is --

5 MR. HEED: [Indiscernible.]

6 MR. PINNOCK: It was getting a little tired after
7 about 30 years of ownership with Wade and Roy.
8 But I'll tell you, it's fabulous.

9 MR. HEED: Is it?

10 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah. They may have sunk half a
11 million to a million in terms of upgrading
12 equipment and, you know, introducing more
13 contemporary approaches to fitness like CrossFit
14 stuff and --

15 MR. HEED: Yeah. Yeah, yeah.

16 MR. PINNOCK: -- you know, battle ropes and tires and
17 all that sort of thing. So it's good. It's
18 good. So when I'm in town, I go there.

19 MR. HEED: Yeah.

20 MR. PINNOCK: And when I'm in [REDACTED] I go to the
21 [REDACTED] standby called My GYM Eternal.

24 MR. HEED: Okay.

25 MR. PINNOCK: Or they say they are, but it's, you

1 know, 6:00 a.m. till 11:00. So it's good.
2 MR. HEED: Well, that's not bad. Is it fairly big,
3 or ...
4 MR. PINNOCK: It's compact up there --
5 MR. HEED: Yeah.
6 MR. PINNOCK: -- but they've got everything. It's
7 really good. And we're actually putting a
8 CrossFit circuit into our house, onto the yard,
9 with a -- you know, a dumb-bell station --
10 MR. HEED: Yeah.
11 MR. PINNOCK: -- going up to hundreds or so.
12 MR. HEED: Yeah.
13 MR. PINNOCK: Some TRX stuff.
14 MR. HEED: Yeah.
15 MR. PINNOCK: We got tires up on the parking lot for
16 going along the side of the road, a sledgehammer

MR. PINNOCK: Yeah.

MR. HEED: Yeah.

MR. PINNOCK: Yeah. Yeah.

MR. HEED: We all know that.

MR. PINNOCK: Yeah. You know --

MR. HEED: [Indiscernible] have a lawyer.

MR. PINNOCK: I do.

MR. HEED: Is it [indiscernible]?

MR. PINNOCK: Yeah, I do. He's one of my oldest

1 friends.

2 MR. HEED: Is he?

3 MR. PINNOCK: We were university teammates in

4 football.

5 MR. HEED: Carleton?

6 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah.

7 MR. HEED: Yeah.

8 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah, good for you. And Paul is not

9 conventional. He's had a David and Goliath

10 practice for 35 years. So he's a sole

11 practitioner. He's taken on big banks and big

12 insurance companies. Works the Supreme Court of

13 Canada by himself.

14 MR. HEED: Yeah.

15 MR. PINNOCK: And I'm looking forward to seeing him

16 in an action. He's a strong litigator. He's

17 not in it for the money. But if this does

18 result in people being cross-examined, this will

19 be fun to watch.

20 MR. HEED: Where are you on that?

21 MR. PINNOCK: Scheduled to meet with counsel for the

22 AG a week Monday.

23 MR. HEED: Who's their counsel?

24 MR. PINNOCK: A guy by the name of Scott. Sean Hern

25 from Farris based out of Victoria, I think.

1 MR. HEED: Here's the conflict: Holman law firm is
2 Farris.
3 MR. PINNOCK: Holman?
4 MR. HEED: He's been at Farris for years, threatening
5 to sue people.
6 MR. PINNOCK: Well, McIntosh and Hector are both --
7 MR. HEED: Trial judges. Well, Hector and McIntosh
8 is.
9 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah. Hector MacKay-Dunn is a partner
10 in Farris.
11 MR. HEED: Sure. Well, I'm [indiscernible].
12 Long-time Liberal guy too.
13 MR. PINNOCK: I remember.
14 MR. HEED: Co-chaired the campaign.
15 MR. PINNOCK: M'mm-hmm. He wasn't a Christy guy, I
16 don't think. I think he's a disaffected Liberal
17 now.
18 MR. HEED: Allan Seckel went to work with Garreth
19 [phonetic] when he left government, so I wonder
20 if they're in a bit of a conflict.
21 MR. PINNOCK: Oh.
22 MR. HEED: [Indiscernible.]
23 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah.
24 MR. HEED: Seckel was deputy attorney general.
25 MR. PINNOCK: I remember, yeah.

1 MR. HEED: And then he became deputy minister to
2 Campbell.
3 MR. PINNOCK: I remember that now, yeah.
4 MR. HEED: [Indiscernible.]
5 MR. PINNOCK: It's a big outfit. I'll tell Paul
6 about that.
7 MR. HEED: Sure.
8 MR. PINNOCK: So Wayne's hard to track down; hey?
9 MR. HEED: You know, I had a long chat with him. The
10 problem with Wayne is he knows everything that
11 went on. He knows [indiscernible] now too. He
12 doesn't have any future prospects, but he won't
13 fucking talk about it. He won't come out.
14 MR. PINNOCK: Does it --
15 MR. HEED: We talk in private about it. He will not
16 come out.
17 MR. PINNOCK: Now, is he --
18 MR. HEED: I don't know what [indiscernible] he's
19 afraid of. He's retired. He's got -- I asked
20 him, are you [indiscernible]? He says no.
21 [Indiscernible.]
22 MR. PINNOCK: Oh.
23 MR. HEED: [Indiscernible.]
24 MR. PINNOCK: [Indiscernible.]
25 MR. HEED: A little frustrating.

1 MR. PINNOCK: Because after I left, he would have
2 watched the whole charade.
3 MR. HEED: He knew it.
4 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah.
5 MR. HEED: He knew everything that was going on.
6 MR. PINNOCK: And he authored the report suggesting I
7 get -- be expended.
8 MR. HEED: He also argued that the positions need to
9 be filled now. Remember he left those positions
10 open? [Indiscernible].
11 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah.
12 MR. HEED: And he argued [indiscernible].
13 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah.
14 MR. HEED: But he won't come out and talk about this.
15 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah.
16 MR. HEED: And he won't [indiscernible].
17 MR. PINNOCK: Did I ever tell you -- I must have.
18 You know [REDACTED] is a milk toast; hey?
19 [Indiscernible.] He's not a hard guy.
20 MR. HEED: Yeah.
21 MR. PINNOCK: He's a softie. Anyway, as you know,
22 with project work you're not going to have a
23 statistical line on the graph. You do
24 takedowns, disclosure, ramp up, particularly
25 when you've got 9 or 10 guys.

1 MR. HEED: Yeah, yeah.

2 MR. PINNOCK: So at one semi-annual consultative
3 board meeting I had no criminal code charges
4 laid the previous six months because we were
5 ramping up. We were productive, but --

6 MR. HEED: Yeah.

7 MR. PINNOCK: -- just not during that particular
8 semi-annual --

9 MR. HEED: Reporting?

10 MR. PINNOCK: -- reporting period.

11 MR. HEED: Yeah.

12 MR. PINNOCK: And Donny Adam, to whom I reported for
13 a while, said, [REDACTED] is coming to the
14 meeting, and there's a -- just to give you a
15 sense of who's there, [REDACTED] [REDACTED],
16 both the ADMs under ministry of -- under your
17 ministry.

18 MR. HEED: Yeah.

19 MR. PINNOCK: A representative from BC ACP, the CEO
20 of BC Lottery Corp., the two former members who
21 were directors of GPEB, and a couple of
22 Mounties, Adam and [REDACTED].

23 MR. HEED: Yeah.

24 MR. PINNOCK: [REDACTED] made a surprise appearance. So
25 Don Adam called me in advance and said, if the

1 dip in your unit's production comes up, would
2 you please basically fall on your sword, so
3 as --

4 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Is that the right one?

5 MR. HEED: Yeah.

6 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Okay. Awesome.

7 Anything else I can grab you?

8 MR. PINNOCK: We're all good so far. Thank you.

9 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Okay.

10 MR. PINNOCK: So as not to embarrass the chief, [REDACTED]
11 [REDACTED] knew all about the dip. And he's not an
12 organized crime guy, but he understands the ebbs
13 and flows of stats.

14 MR. HEED: Yeah.

15 MR. PINNOCK: Anyway, I said early in my presentation
16 to the board -- this was such theatre, Kash. I
17 said, as most of you know, since my last roundup
18 of illegal gaming houses --

19 MR. HEED: Yeah.

20 MR. PINNOCK: We took down eight about six months
21 earlier.

22 MR. HEED: Yeah. [Indiscernible].

23 MR. PINNOCK: But there's been no criminal code stats
24 since, just to -- I just want you to be aware.
25 And all of a sudden [REDACTED] explodes. What? What?

1 I didn't know this. Like off Broadway.

2 MR. HEED: In front of everyone?

3 MR. PINNOCK: In front of everybody. Just fucking
4 humiliating the shit out of me in front of all
5 my clients, and it -- Kash, like, that little
6 milk toast yelling at me. Are you fucking
7 kidding me? But it was great theatre. Anyway,
8 I shut my mouth and kept calm, said my good-byes
9 at the end of this blood-letting exercise, went
10 out to my car with fucking chest pains, drove
11 around the block. I had to pull over. I've got
12 a cold sweat happening, thinking I have to go to
13 emerge, man. Anyway, I got a call from Don Adam
14 while I was sitting there idling in the car
15 parking --

16 MR. HEED: Yeah.

17 MR. PINNOCK: -- feeling like I was having a jammer.

18 MR. HEED: Yeah.

19 MR. PINNOCK: And they -- everybody else had cleared
20 out. He just called and said, I just want you
21 to know that both the chief and I really
22 appreciate what you did in there, falling on
23 your sword.

24 MR. HEED: For that piece of shit?

25 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah. So it was all intended to make

1 ██████ look like a solid guy who was not in the
2 loop. Had he known, by golly, this never would
3 have happened. So -- and I remember what he
4 said as -- at the end of his shit-kicking of me
5 in public was, we certainly wouldn't want to
6 embarrass the minister. And you know what
7 minister he was referring to.

8 MR. HEED: Holmes.

9 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah. Because ██████ and ██████ -- and
10 ██████████████████ were both his good looking lap dogs.

11 MR. HEED: Fucking ██████

12 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah.

13 MR. HEED: Piece of shit.

14 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah.

15 MR. HEED: I slammed him into [indiscernible] thing I
16 did after [indiscernible].

17 MR. PINNOCK: That was the end for me.

18 MR. HEED: Yeah. [Indiscernible]. That's Monty,
19 right, [indiscernible] all the stuff. They're
20 criminals. They're the ones that should be in
21 jail.

22 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah, you know, Kash, I had a trip mate
23 who saw the interview on TV that I did a couple
24 months back.

25 MR. HEED: Yeah, yeah.

1 MR. PINNOCK: He said Fred, be careful; those fuckers
2 are like the mafia, talking about the senior
3 Mounties.
4 MR. HEED: Exactly.
5 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah.
6 MR. HEED: That's exactly how Monty described it too.
7 They operate like the mafia.
8 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah.
9 MR. HEED: Because I can tell you right now,
10 [indiscernible] hopefully you do have some --
11 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: I can get that out of
12 the way for you.
13 MR. HEED: Yes. Thank you.
14 Hopefully you do have some significant
15 reports and material, that they're not sitting
16 at your [indiscernible] but they're
17 [indiscernible] in a whole state in his office.
18 Because they will execute a search warrant and
19 say those -- that's their property.
20 MR. PINNOCK: I'll respond to that directly. Kash, I
21 was so fucking beaten up when I left, looking at
22 my old notebooks. I kept them at a PI firm for
23 a while. Then when I got bought out, I brought
24 it home when I started working for Intact. And
25 I had it in my home office, and looking at that

1 stack of big black notebooks, it was killing me.
2 I said, I should be calling out that material --
3 MR. HEED: Yeah.
4 MR. PINNOCK: -- and I should be suing these guys for
5 doing this to me, but it was so draining and so
6 energy-sucking, I just threw them all away. I
7 have kept nothing, not one report, not one
8 notebook except for my homicide notebooks for
9 undercover where I had upcoming trials. That's
10 it. Nothing. So I'm preparing my evidence for
11 my meeting with counsel for the AG.
12 MR. HEED: Yeah.
13 MR. PINNOCK: And my opening line is, I have no
14 documentation to corroborate what I've said.
15 MR. HEED: Yeah. They fear you do.
16 MR. PINNOCK: I do not.
17 MR. HEED: They fear you do.
18 MR. PINNOCK: They fear I do, yes. I'm sure they do.
19 Yeah. So I basically finish that paragraph by
20 saying, for verification and corroboration, it's
21 going to require other witnesses and a rigorous
22 FOI --
23 MR. HEED: Yeah.
24 MR. PINNOCK: -- exercise because I've got nothing.
25 I'm just telling you what I know, what I heard,

1 what I saw.

2 MR. HEED: The DOJ will block the FOI just like on
3 Monty Robinson. They blocked it. They're -- by
4 law they've not responded on dates they require,
5 all of that stuff. They will delay it. They
6 will not release it. They will not release it,
7 guaranteed. Guaranteed.

8 MR. PINNOCK: Or heavy redacting.

9 MR. HEED: Even the redacting. You won't even see
10 the redacting. They'll delay, delay, delay,
11 delay, delay. They don't care. Nobody ever
12 comes after them. Nobody holds them
13 accountable.

14 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah.

15 MR. HEED: You know, tell me what fucking leader in
16 the RCMP has ever been held accountable for --

17 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah.

18 MR. HEED: -- [indiscernible].

19 MR. PINNOCK: No.

20 MR. HEED: You know, harassment, sexual harassment --

21 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah.

22 MR. HEED: -- workplace harassment, all of that. One
23 person that they've held accountable -- they
24 held these four young officers accountable for
25 YVR, when all they did was respond based on the

1 current policy and the training of the
2 organization at that time. Policy training,
3 policy training. They've got to be patient.
4 Well, Brindle [phonetic] [indiscernible] who was
5 in charge of Richmond and all that --

6 MR. PINNOCK: I remember that.

7 MR. HEED: -- and even the internal that was done on
8 that saying the members followed our current
9 whatever, blah, blah, blah, cited off whatever
10 report it was or whatever. Over and over and
11 over it says it.

12 MR. PINNOCK: You know, Kash, the organization's out
13 of control. I -- if the scope of whatever
14 investigation or inquiry is expanded to include
15 political interference in policing, there are so
16 many examples.

17 MR. HEED: Oh, BC's probably -- well, they're all
18 like that, but BC, you know, given, you know, my
19 experience and even trying -- them trying to
20 politically influence me when I was there --
21 it's incredible. It's fucking incredible. [REDACTED]

MR. HEED: I'm heads.

MR. PINNOCK: I'm tails.

UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Okay.

MR. PINNOCK: Apparently.

1 today. I haven't done this in a very long time.

2 MR. HEED: With [REDACTED] over there. Callens is doing
3 some work over there.

4 MR. PINNOCK: Is Clayton still the director?

5 MR. HEED: Yeah. He's a former Mountie, though,
6 really.

7 MR. PINNOCK: Pretty good guy, though, I think.

8 MR. HEED: [Indiscernible.]

9 MR. PINNOCK: Is he?

10 MR. HEED: He is at the whim of government.

11 MR. PINNOCK: Is he?

12 MR. HEED: Whatever they say, he does.

13 MR. PINNOCK: Okay.

14 MR. HEED: Whatever Lori Wanamaker told him to do, he
15 did.

16 MR. PINNOCK: Who is Lori Wanamaker?

17 MR. HEED: She was the deputy minister. She's been
18 with Coleman --

19 MR. PINNOCK: Was she?

20 MR. HEED: -- for years.

21 MR. PINNOCK: Oh, okay.

22 MR. HEED: She was always with Coleman.

23 MR. PINNOCK: Okay. And that's why the gaming
24 file --

25 MR. HEED: Yeah.

1 MR. PINNOCK: -- followed him around.

2 MR. HEED: Yeah. Gaming and housing followed him
3 around. Liquor did for a while, but they hived
4 off liquor. But gaming and housing is always
5 his. You wonder why his family accumulated so
6 much money. His brother, who is in labour or
7 something like that, a millionaire.

8 MR. PINNOCK: Really? I know he's got --

9 MR. HEED: [Indiscernible] he's had some lucky land
10 deals.

11 MR. PINNOCK: Okay. I remember hearing that one
12 brother is a prof at Carleton, poli-sci prof.

13 MR. HEED: Are you sure it's his brother?

14 MR. PINNOCK: I think so. I thought so. My
15 next-door neighbour in [REDACTED] knows his family
16 because that's where Rich grew up, hey,
17 Penticton.

18 Anyway, did I ever tell you this: I was the
19 devil, hey, because I was always screaming about
20 getting real police into the casino. Everybody
21 was fucking mad at me. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Coleman.
22 There was a BC liberal event. I think it was in
23 2010 well after the -- you guys were first
24 elected. I extended my hand to him.

25 MR. HEED: To Coleman?

1 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah. And he grabbed me. Out of tens
2 of thousands of handshakes in my life --

3 MR. HEED: Yeah.

4 MR. PINNOCK: -- this is the only time this has
5 happened. He grabbed me by the hand and tried
6 to fucking squeeze the shit out of my fingers.
7 Fucking deliberate attempt to injure.

8 MR. HEED: Should have fucking flattened him.

9 MR. PINNOCK: Well, you know what? It would have
10 been a different outcome if it hadn't been like
11 a fundraiser. I wouldn't have let him get away
12 with it. But I just thought okay, maybe we'll
13 chat one day. I don't know. But you know he --
14 that's just a cheap bully thing we learn in --
15 at recess in grade 4; you know?

16 MR. HEED: Well, I've hammered Eby on him appointing
17 [REDACTED] as the -- shouldn't get three fucking
18 contracts. Three contracts. He's got ICBC,
19 he's got housing -- or real estate, and he's got
20 the gaming.

21 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah.

22 MR. HEED: Imagine.

23 MR. PINNOCK: Real estate --

24 MR. HEED: They're not interviewing Walter Soo.

25 MR. PINNOCK: Walter Soo or me.

1 MR. HEED: You weren't interviewed?
2 MR. PINNOCK: No, I was not.
3 MR. HEED: [Indiscernible] interview you.
4 [Indiscernible] everybody knew what they were
5 going to say.
6 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah. A very benign document.
7 MR. HEED: See, I know the whistle-blower.
8 MR. PINNOCK: You mentioned.
9 MR. HEED: Yeah.
10 MR. PINNOCK: Ross?
11 MR. HEED: Ross --

4 guys who work in the casinos themselves.

5 MR. HEED: No, these two were delivering whatever
6 power they had with Ross [indiscernible] files.

7 MR. PINNOCK: I'll bet you he was a GPEB guy.

8 MR. HEED: [Indiscernible], yeah.

9 MR. PINNOCK: And --

10 MR. HEED: He was former police officer from
11 Australia.

12 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah, you mentioned. Yeah. Well, it
13 wouldn't have sat well with the director level
14 of GPEB if the government was in any way tainted
15 by an investigation because it's all a game.
16 It's about keeping old Mounties employed, you
17 know, and not ruffling feathers. When Cal
18 Cussie [phonetic] was approached before my time
19 with [indiscernible], he was told by the then

3 he recommended that Tom apply, and Tom did, and
4 that's who I succeeded a year later.

5 MR. HEED: Do you trust Cal Cussie.

6 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah, I think he's a good hearted guy.

7 MR. HEED: What's he doing now?

8 MR. PINNOCK: He is doing piecemeal stuff. He's got
9 some international hostage negotiation
10 experience, so I don't know exactly, but he's
11 got an income happening. I think Cal's a good
12 guy. He was very aggressive. Too aggressive, I
13 think, for the Mounties. I thought he did a
14 good job there, from what I heard. Refs up. A
15 couple of big files, big convictions,
16 international in scope, you know, so ...

17 MR. HEED: I really don't know him.

18 MR. PINNOCK: I know there are varying opinions, but
19 I -- I don't know. I think his heart's in the
20 right place. Pretty fearless.

21 MR. HEED: Yeah.

22 MR. PINNOCK: And that'll make you enemies, as you
23 know. If you're not driven by fear, you're
24 going to be polarized. Polarizing -- fear and
25 self-interest. Those are the two devils, hey, I

1 think --

2 MR. HEED: As a whole, it's all management by fear.

3 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah.

4 MR. HEED: That's all it is.

5 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah. Yeah. So it's -- you know, it's

6 all a cozy game. You play nice --

7 MR. HEED: Yeah.

8 MR. PINNOCK: -- because somebody's going to beat you

9 up if you don't. And you cave and you abandon

10 your principles and, you know, get nice

11 contracts with government after.

12 MR. HEED: Unbelievable.

13 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah. You know, I also -- personally,

14 I know [REDACTED] comes into criticism once in a

15 while. I don't think he's one of them.

16 MR. HEED: [REDACTED]

17 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah, I don't think he's --

18 MR. HEED: Oh, fuck, he is.

19 MR. PINNOCK: Is he?

20 MR. HEED: He is [indiscernible]. He is.

21 MR. PINNOCK: I never saw it.

22 MR. HEED: He let them get away with all that stuff.

23 Oh, yeah. [REDACTED] is complacent as you would --

24 could imagine. He always makes like he's not.

25 He is just fucking [indiscernible].

1 MR. PINNOCK: I just never saw it. He always seemed
2 to be the lone voice of reason in a bunch of --
3 with a bunch of idiots around him, I thought.

4 MR. HEED: Well, that's the public persona wise guy.
5 In private he was just one of them. One of
6 fucking them.

7 MR. PINNOCK: Yeah. I guess I was a few rungs down,
8 and I didn't see it too much.

9 MR. HEED: [Indiscernible]. So they came over to see
10 me in Victoria. I think I might have
11 [indiscernible]. So they came over to see me
12 because we were discussing the provincial
13 funding, and you know ICBC [indiscernible]
14 helicopter. So they've got this second
15 Eurocopter in. They came over and said, we need
16 more funding for the helicopter. We grounded it
17 because you can't [indiscernible] you can't
18 afford [indiscernible]. How much more do you
19 need? \$5 million or something like that for the
20 rest of the year. I said okay, why don't you
21 just take it out of your budget? Well, there's
22 [REDACTED] and there's [REDACTED] You can't do that.
23 I said well, you've got 93 vacant spots; okay?
24 Before I give you any more money for your
25 helicopters, why don't you fill the spots in?

1 Well, fuck, they [indiscernible]. They almost
2 storm out. The meeting only lasted 20 minutes
3 or [indiscernible].

4 MR. PINNOCK: Really?

5 MR. HEED: They fucking stormed out. I get a phone
6 call from my buddy over here. He says, how did
7 the meeting go? [Indiscernible] fucking around.
