CONSENT

WHEREAS by Notice of Decision dated October 1, 2010, the Director of the Financial Transactions and Reports Analysis Centre of Canada (the "Director" and "FINTRAC" respectively) imposed an administrative monetary penalty against the *British Columbia Lottery Corporation* (BCLC) under provisions of the *Proceeds of Crime (Money Laundering) and Terrorist Financing Act* (the "Act") and the *Proceeds of Crime (Money Laundering) and Terrorist Financing Regulations* (the "Decision");

AND WHEREAS on October 29, 2010, the *British Columbia Lottery Corporation* filed an appeal of the Decision to the Federal Court (the "Appeal");

AND WHEREAS in the course of an internal review following the commencement of the appeal FINTRAC issued a Revised List of Instances reducing the

Number of violations committed and at the same time reduced the proposed administrative monetary penalty;

AND WHEREAS the British Columbia Lottery Corporation, following its own internal review, acknowledges there were technical administrative violations in its reporting and provided evidence of due diligence;

AND WHEREAS the parties have determined that violations were reasonably attributable to technical matters such as software management and data entry issues and were remedied by BCLC;

AND WHEREAS FINTRAC is satisfied that the technical administrative violations were quickly remedied and that subsequent compliance examinations demonstrated enhanced compliance;

AND WHEREAS the Director believes it is in the public interest that the Decision be varied on appeal:

1. On consent, the parties agree that the appeal from the Decision of the Director be allowed to vary the Decision of the Director by means of an Order, to be issued by the Federal Court in the form and content attached as Schedule "A" to this Consent.





I write to you with the agreement of, Ms. Henein, counsel for the Appellant, British Columbia Lottery Corporation. By letter dated July 28, 2017 addressed to you Ms. Henein advised that the parties had come to a resolution of this matter and requested that a telephone conference with a judge be arranged on or after August 4. 2017 to discuss the final order and other housekeeping matters.

The parties have executed a consent setting out the terms of disposition of the appeal in a draft order annexed thereto to be submitted to the court for approval.
