Deputy Chief Constable Brett Crosby-Jones has been employed with the Abbotsford Police Department for the past 30 years, having been appointed to his current role as Deputy Chief Constable in charge of Operations in 2018.

Throughout his career, Brett has assembled a demonstrated history of accomplishment within the operational, investigative, and administrative realms of the Police department. He has served in a senior leadership role in the Operations Support Branch, where he led the departments response to the homelessness crisis in Abbotsford; and in the Investigative Support Branch, developing the Gang Crime Unit and implementing new processes related to high risk information.

Deputy Crosby-Jones Operational experience includes over 25 years with the Emergency Response team as an Operator, Crisis Negotiator, Senior Non-Commissioned Officer and Critical Incident Commander. His Investigative experience include both constable and leadership roles in Crime Suppression, Strike Force, Street Crime, Patrol, Bike Squad, and Detective roles throughout his career.
